REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel icensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show
(a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regula

A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from
(b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these

Regulations then he/she may be subjected to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42
(a) No substance which alters the natural colour/texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
(b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for
exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
(a) Operation certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
(b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the ground for the objection. Th Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection on its behalf.
Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in wiring to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS- Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

* If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. to drink.
* Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog
* When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade-take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of wate available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

* Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time dire results. Please ho

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognized by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing date shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 25th April 24 Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.
