Rosettes: awarded to 6th place in all classes

Equine Passports: All equine passports to be presented to the Light Horse Secretary upon arrival. Neither vaccination certificates nor passports should be sent to the show office prior to the event.

Supreme Championship: All 1st and 2nd prize winners are eligible for the supreme championship at the end of the day

Equine Flu – Northumberland County Show

Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all pony/horses attending the Northumberland County Show.

The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter.

No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an Equine Influenza vaccination.

This rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF and competitors will be notified of any changes prior to the show.

In-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course.

We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times.

London International Horse Show Showing Series

The following classes are qualifiers for the London International Horse Show December 2026: **E17, E18, E27, E28, E29-E33, E43-46, E82, E83**

BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION LIHS SHOWING SERIES CLASSES

Conditions: Direct qualifiers for finals at London International Horse Show



Competitors and horses must hold a minimum of LIHS Qualifier-Eligible Membership/ Horse Registration with the Association to be eligible to compete in the LIHS BSHA Showing series. Any competitor who qualifies for a LIHS Showing Series Supreme Final, must then complete full LIHS Qualified registration within 14 days of qualification for their qualification to stand, or it will pass to the next eligible exhibit (the nominal cost of Qualifier-Eligible membership will be taken off the cost of Full LIHS registration). Any competitors/ horses which have existing BSHA membership/ registration for 2026 will not be required to complete any LIHS Membership / Registration for these classes.

Please note: Rising Star Amateur Rules 2026 are separate from BSHA Amateur rules. Please see the separate Rising Star Rulebook in the Rising Star section available on the BSHA website. <https://britishshowhorse.org/bsha-rising-stars-series> **If you are in any doubt regarding your Rising Star Amateur status, please contact the BSHA Office directly, to have your status confirmed.**

Classes E17, E18, E43-E46 E82 and E83 qualify for BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in top 5 to qualify. A results points table will run for all qualifying classes and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

No competitor previously deemed a showing Professional / Producer, may be permitted to enter LIHS Rising star classes.

- JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes.
- The Judge's decision is final.
- The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes.

FINALISTS - The BSHA will offer training clinics nearer the event to prepare all competitors before the finals.

British Show Pony Society



This show is affiliated to the **British Show Pony Society (BSPS)**, and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS classes, whether or not members of the BSPS, are subject to the rules of the BSPS, including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.

This show is a qualifier for the **2026 BSPS Championships Show**, to be held at Arena UK.

The 1st and 2nd prize winners only in open classes in the following sections:

- Show Ponies, Mini Show Ponies, Show Hunter, Working Hunter Ponies and Mini WHP and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize-winners in the Open Intermediate (including Mixed height) W.H. and S.H.T. and C.S.

In mixed height classes the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th placed ponies will qualify for the **BSPS Championships Show**, provided the animal is registered in accordance with Rules 21 and 26 and ridden by a BSPS member.

This show is a qualifier for the **BSPS Thor Atkinson Steel Fabrication Ltd Challenge** (see Rule 487). Animals competing in the following Open classes will qualify:

- Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WHP, Intermediate SH, SRT and WH and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes.

This show is a qualifier for the **BSPS View Point Champion of Champions**. The 1st prize winners in the following classes will qualify:

- Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Intermediate Riding Horse, Hack and Hunter type. and WH and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes.

Owners and riders must be BSPS members before the date of the show to qualify in classes with qualification for BLUE RIBBAND & RIHS and animals must be registered with the BSPS. Membership forms and payment must be received in the office no later than the last working day (Monday to Friday) prior to the date of the qualifying show. (See Rule 20)

Riders in BSPS classes will be required to adhere to rules 43 and 50 in the 2026 BSPS Rulebook with regard to hat specification, tagging and body protectors.



The Royal International Horse Show

This show is a qualifier for the **Young Dragonara Riders Challenge**.
N.B. the RIHS qualification is subject to confirmation from BSPS. head office.



National Pony Society (NPS)

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part-breds are not eligible unless overstamp into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the **NPS Summer Championship Show** at Malvern from 4th – 6th August 2026. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship: Riders of Home-Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the **NPS Summer Championship Show**. The Owner's Membership cards **MUST** be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.



CHAPS (UK)

This Show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). **Affiliation No. 25-049**

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need NOT be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to qualify both owner and rider/exhibitor need to be a current showing member and have a valid qualifier card. Members to apply in to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com. Only "coloured" horses and ponies (as defined in the current CHAPS UK Members' Handbook) may compete in these classes.

All stallions, 4 yrs old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). **All stallions must wear Stallion ID discs in the ring without exception**



Caledonian Showing Championships

This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season

This year's show will be held at

Howe EC, near Ladybank, Fife on 16/17/18 October 2026

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all Inhand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. Second place in all the RIHS and LIHS classes will also qualify.

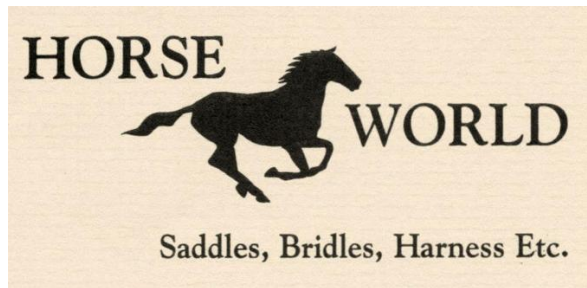

Best Shod Horse - Worshipful Company of Farriers - Judge: Mr H Dyer

The Judge will examine each horse/pony before or during the line-up for preliminary judging, taking into consideration:

- a) the condition of the feet
- b) the making (or preparation) and fitting of the shoes
- c) the nailing and the position of the clips

Normal shoes and showing plates are equally acceptable, providing they are suitable for the horse/pony.

A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult Member and Junior Member of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. 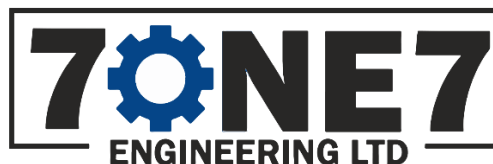
